LtCol Mullins asked me to compile a summary of the B61-11 Kick-off meeting yesterday for Col Ostrander. He (Bill) will be back in the office on Friday.

In general, the meeting went fairly well. ATSD(AE) inputs were in the same vein as the SAF/AQQS tasking. Representatives from all major organizations involved with the modification program attended

The baseline proposal meets weight, CG and roll momentum requirements for the B61-7. The pitch and yaw momentum is about 10% high. However, calculations indicate the delivery profile and CEP will not be affected.

The major discussion issues which NWI will be working on over the next few weeks include a classification guide, draft MC's and STS.

Other issues included decisions on retirement rates and timelines for the B53 as B61-11s are retrofitted and stressing cases for the weapon in the target area. DOE wants to retire the B53s as the new weapons are coming on line. However, it was pointed out that that would be a STRATCOM issue and more complex than it may appear, since we must also have the carriers and planning capability in place.
